# CELEBRATION OF MISSION

## NEIGHBOR TO NEIGHBOR



We provided the first major gift of \$100,000 to the Cohen Center, which opened in August 2022 as the new home for Neighbor to Neighbor. Our gift sponsored the food workroom for sorting and storing frozen and fresh foods and non-perishables. In 2022, 667 households received food supplements to provide 630,324 meals.

## HAITI-ST. MARC'S SCHOOL



In 2017, we partnered with SUMMITS Education and provided \$100,000 seed money for K-6 education in the remote area of Artibonite Department. In January 2021, St. Marc's School opened to 164 students and was given an exemplary award. Plans and funding are in place to build 5 more schools using the St Marc's blueprint.

## REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT



For over 40 years, First Pres has been committed to resettling refugees. From meeting families in flip flops at the airport to covering a first year's rent, furnishing homes with beds, registering children for school, applying for jobs and setting up bank accounts, we have helped families find a new place to call home.

## JACKSON MISSION



Our youth group spent a week working with a ministry founded by John Perkins, a Civil Rights leader. The group lead a day camp for children, rehabbed homes, and visited the Mississippi Civil Rights Museum.

## 1001 HOURS

We did it! From packing 500 pounds of rice and beans to sending supplies to Ukrainian refugees in Poland, from leading children's day camps in Jackson, Mississippi to helping Afghan Evacuees find employment, nearly 160 First Pres members committed over 1001 hours to make a difference in our community, country and world!
